

Things to Watch for

- **Turn in your monthly eligibility form.**
If you are late, you will lose your work deductions included in steps 1 to 5. Without the deductions you will get less TANF/TAONF, maybe none at all.
- **Plan for welfare office budgeting delays.** It takes the welfare department two months to recalculate your welfare grant. For example, you report your March earnings at the beginning of April and the welfare office uses it to figure your May TANF/TAONF grant. This is great when you start working but very hard when your earnings go down.
- **Ceiling on earnings.** There is a limit on how much you can earn and still get TANF/TAONF. The ceiling is 185% of TANF/TAONF for a family the same size as your family.
