

Housing discrimination can be obvious.

Other times, it is more difficult to identify.

Here are some scenarios that may be housing discrimination, depending on the details:



Your landlord refuses to consider making changes to your apartment to accommodate your disability.



Your landlord refuses to accept emergency rental assistance from a program to help with your past due rent.



Your landlord fixes apartment problems quickly for tenants of one race, but slowly for tenants of another race.



Your landlord tries to evict you or your rental application is denied because you are a victim of domestic violence.
