

ACCESS TO JUSTICE ROOMS

The Access to Justice Room is staffed by volunteer attorneys and AmeriCorps Advocates. The attorney provides free, short-term legal services and **legal advice** to people who need legal help.

All sessions are limited to a certain amount of time, and information shared is confidential and only disclosed to the attorney and AmeriCorps Advocate present. The volunteer attorney does not represent a person after their time spent in The Access to Justice Room is over.

SELF-HELP CENTERS

The Self-Help Centers are staffed by volunteer attorneys and AmeriCorps Advocates. The attorney does not give legal advice but provides **free legal information**. The attorney and AmeriCorps Advocates may also help with understanding the court process and filing court forms.

QUALIFICATIONS

There are no qualifications needed to seek help at The Access To Justice Rooms and Court Self-Help Centers. However, we only help with civil matters. Please thoroughly review this brochure to see what locations and islands provide assistance with specific types of matters.

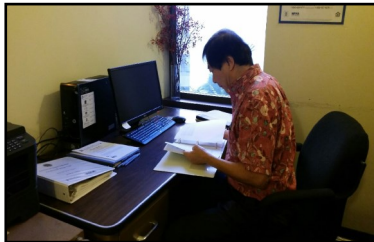

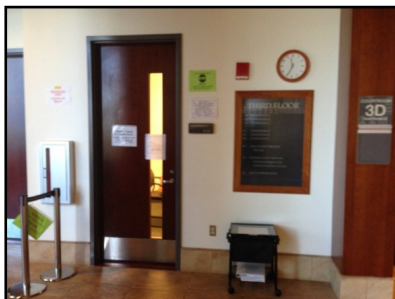


- The Access To Justice Room of Oahu is located at the Honolulu District Court on the third floor.
- The Access To Justice Room primarily focuses on landlord-tenant issues, small claims, temporary restraining orders, and debt collection.
- To speak to an attorney you must sign in at the Honolulu District Court Service Center first, which is located next to the room. Walk-ins on a first come first serve basis, no appointments.

- The Kapolei Access to Justice Room primarily focuses on Family Law matters and has volunteer attorneys available.
- There are 24 appointment slots for each day and clients may sign-up for a half-hour appointment through the Family Court Ho'okele Center.
- Clients check in on the 3rd floor and are given an informational sheet to fill out prior to their appointment. Walk-ins are available only if there is a cancellation.

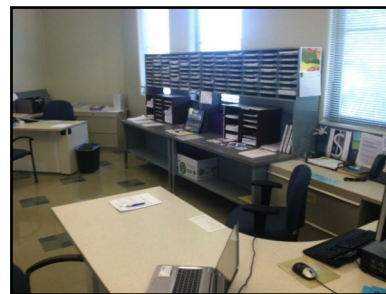


- Maui has a self-help center consisting of an attorney and AmeriCorps member.
